Definition/Overview	<ul> <li>Role of the Community School Director (CSD)</li> <li>Hired by a committee that includes school and community stakeholders</li> <li>Acts as a leader in the school building</li> <li>Sits on the principal's cabinet/school leadership team</li> <li>Has access to student-level data</li> </ul>
Fast Facts	Collaborative leadership between teachers and Community School directors helps create a common and aligned vision, supports individualized services for students who need them, fosters family leadership and expertise, and creates a rigorous and responsive academic environment. Three core practices that help collaborative leadership thrive in Community Schools include a community school team, shared leadership between the CSD and principal and community partnerships. Three collaborative practices that teachers embrace in community schools include: joint professional development and planning time, sharing data and ongoing communication, and academic alignment with expanded learning opportunities.
	Teachers are fundamental in the process of continuous improvement



	in community schools. Teachers hold unique data about students, and are often the closest contact to them and their families in the school community. It's crucial for teachers to have a seat at the table when community schools are designing programs and initiatives as well as being part of program self-assessment and evaluation during the year.
